## **Alternative** Admissions Policy Students who meet the minimum GPA requirement of 2.0 (4.0 scale) will be reviewed on an individual basis with considerations given to a combination of GPA, Class Rank, High School Curriculum, and Standardized Test Scores (if available). Students may need to submit a Counselor Recommendation Form as part of the alternative admissions process. \*We encourage students to sit for the ACT or SAT tests, as consideration for most university scholarships require an official test score.
